

Determining the Correct Remote

Golight, Inc. – Determining the correct remote:

Do you still have the remote? Under the batteries you may find a small decal. It might be a red dot or it might be a silver dot with a letter. It is possible that there is no decal and if that is the case check for a set of seven small three position dip switches. With that information we can supply the proper replacement remote.

- 1. Does your light have "Sealed Beam" imprinted on the lens of the light? If yes go to "a" If no, go to #2.
 - a. You have a preprogrammed remote transmitter. Separate the rubber suction cup from the base of the light, under one of the corners you will find a circular decal with a letter printed on it ranging from A-L. That letter tells us the programmed remote you need. If you have the transmitter and remove the batteries, you will also find a decal underneath the batteries with the same letter.
- 2. Does your light have "Golight" imprinted on the Lens? Yes, go to #3.
- 3. Does your light have "Golight" imprinted on the top of the bezel? (The bezel is the frame that surrounds the lens) IF yes go to #5, if no go to #4.
- 4. For the lights with "Golight" imprinted on the lens and not the bezel, you need remote code #7900-NRD (There were all a different frequency level)
 - a. If you have the transmitter, and take off the battery cover you will see a green panel with switches, when you remove the batteries, there will be no decals under the batteries.
- 5. For the lights with "Golight" imprinted on the lens and the bezel, you need part # 7900-T or 30100
 - a. If you have the transmitter and take off the battery cover you will see a green panel with switches, when you remove the batteries you will find a red colored circular decal.

^{**}Browning lights are 2003 and older. We do not have remotes for these lights.

^{**}If "GOLIGHT" is not on the bezel then it's a Lopin. Lopin remotes are "NRD" remotes. Their circuit boards are gold.
